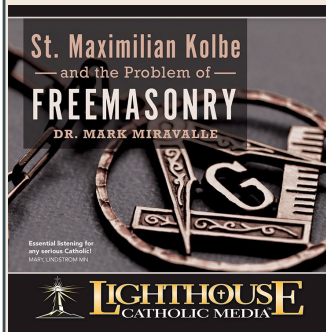

**A SAINT, THE VIRGIN MARY AND FREEMASONRY

The Church just celebrated the Feasts of St. Maximilian Kolbe on August 14 and the Assumption of Mary on August 15. Did you know there is a connection between this great saint and Mary? In this CD, **"St. Maximilian Kolbe and the Problem of FREEMASONRY"**, **Dr. Mark Miravalle** shares the life of this great saint and martyr who started the Militia of the Immaculata, an army of Mary whose goal is to spread Consecration to Mary throughout the world and to pray against the evils of Freemasonry. Dr. Mark Miravalle is a professor of Theology and Mariology at Franciscan University of Steubenville, international speaker, permanent deacon, author of over 16 books on Mary and Mariology, husband and father of eight, and President of the international Catholic movement, Vox Populi Mariae Mediatrici (Voice of the People of Mary Mediatrici.) He has made several

television appearances including EWTN, Fox News and NBC's Dateline among other numerous credits.

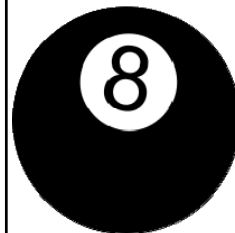

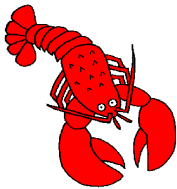
